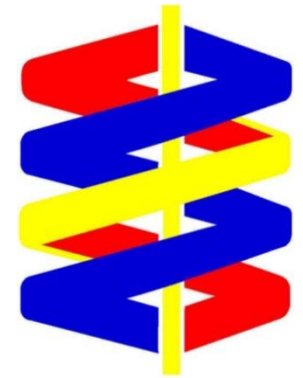


Vertical Tutoring at Beaufort Community School

To allow your tutors to make a more significant contribution to your learning.

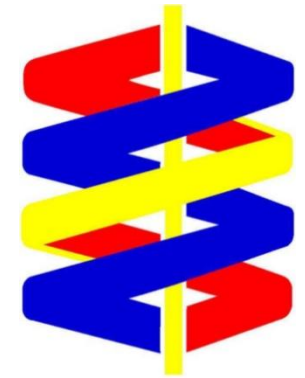
To provide a system that better supports the needs of individual pupils.

To develop the sense of community and respect that already exists in the school.

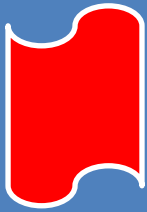
To improve the links between your parents and the School.

House Structure



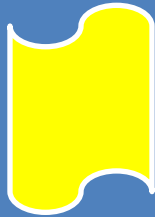

2 Tutors

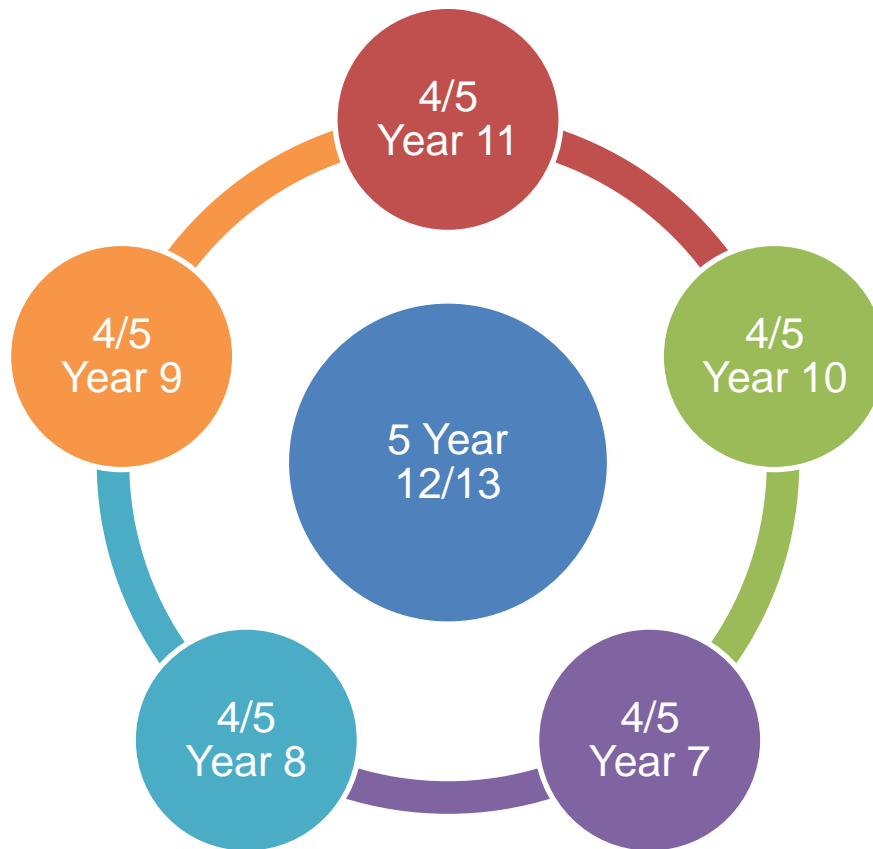


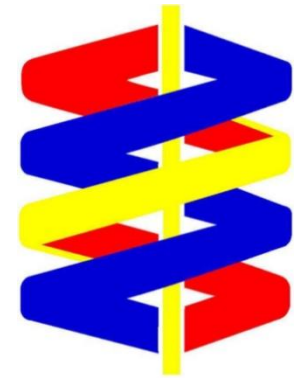
The Tutor Group

Each Tutor Group has a total of c.28 pupils.

Pupils remain in the same Tutor Group from Year 7 – 11

Pupils from the same family in the same House , but not the same Tutor Group





Advantages

Gives you the opportunity to get to know and work with other pupils in different year groups.

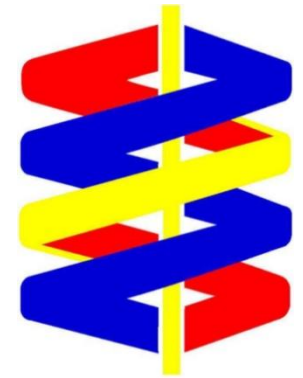
Older pupils can provide guidance and support for younger pupils using their expertise. E.g. Options, Exams, 6th Form choices.

Promotes possibilities for peer mentoring. E.g. Younger pupils progress monitored by a Tutor and an older pupils.

Tutors can focus on smaller groups of pupils at a time.

More opportunities for competition. E.g. Art, Drama, Music, Sport

Create a more inclusive school, without age division.



Communication from teachers to tutors more difficult.

Tutors have to be experts on all year issues.

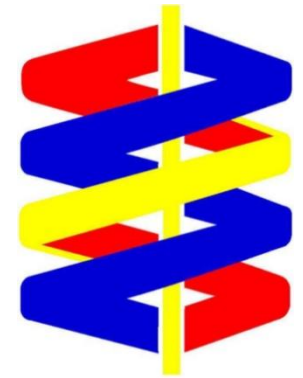
You may feel intimidated by older students.
